It's Christmas week, and life at the clubs is a little light, but there are still some excellent acts worth seeing on the circuit. At the top of the list is the "Father of Bluegrass," Bill Monroe, who makes his regular Wednesday night appear-ance at the Bell Cove in Hendersonville At age 82, Monroe's been an Opry regular since his first appearance, Oct. 28, 1939. He created the bluegrass format by playing mandolin in hyperdrive, adding harmo-nies and lightning-paced fiddles. He influenced a long list of musicians, including Flatt & Scruggs and Ricky Skaggs, who earned a No. 1 country
