Singer Captures 11th Door

"If his nice guy routine is just a put-on, he's got me fooled," 11th Door manager Richard Gammon said of his featured folk singer Emmet (Bobby) Robinson.

And the sparse Wednesday-night crowd saw no fooling in those flying fingers on the guitar and friendly approach as the 26-year-old traveling singer quickly took over. Within minutes, he had each one in the audience singing along unself-consciously even though there were too few people to hide any voice of a day.

Robinson has played in more than 20 of the best-known folk clubs on the East Coast from Florida to New York. Now working his way across country westward, he has agreed to stop here through the weekend.

Through his singing and managing clubs along the way, including the Main Point near Philadelphia, Robinson has worked with folk-singing greats such as Odetta, Tom Paxton, Phil Ochs, Eric Anderson, Len Chandler, Buffy Sainte-Marie, Doc Watson, the Greenbelt Boys and others. Two of his original songs have been published in The Broadsheet.

"That doesn't mean much to you down here, but back up North, it's something special," he said.

Following Robinson on the 11th Door stage that week is Big Bill Moss — with his fancy fingers on 12-string guitar, a contra-bass and a voice that shakes the old rock walls.
